## **CELEBRATE SIX OF THE BEST STARGAZING SPOTS WITH BEST WESTERN GREAT BRITAIN**

### **Norfolk Coast, Norfolk**

There are a whole host of spots along the Norfolk Coast that offer stunning views of the stars, from Cley, Holkham, Sea Palling, Horsey, Happisburgh, Sheringham and Cromerboth. Each of these locations have beautiful walk ways and give stargazers the chance to look up at the Milky Way, the streak of meteors and even neighbouring planets like Venus and Jupiter. With the sound of the sea crashing into the rocks in the distance, this coastline is an ideal relaxation spot. When you're finished relaxing on the coastline, wander inland to stay at Old Hunstanton Le Strange Arms Hotel, BW Signature Collection – priced from £58.50 for a stay on Sunday 29th April for two adults

### **South Downs National Park, Hampshire, West and East Sussex**

Famous for its star-studded skies overhead, 66% of the South Downs National Park is known for having bronze-level skies, which means the Milky Way and Andromeda galaxy can be seen from this spot. With seven stargazing spots to choose from in this park, the opportunities are endless. What's more, when you're finished in South Downs, you can head towards the coast for a stay at Best Western Beachcroft Hotel for £70.20, for a stay on Sunday 29th April, for two adults.

### **Exmoor National Park, Somerset and Devon**

With a multitude of spots to choose from to get the most out of stargazing at Exmoor National Park, the sky can be so clear that on a night with no clouds up to 3,000 stars can be seen by the human eye. ### **Northumberland National Park, Northumberland**

## **Moffat, Dumfries and Galloway**

The Best Western Moffat House Hotel is perfectly situated within Moffat, meaning stargazers won't even need to go far to enjoy the beautiful night skies, with prices from £85 for a stay on the 28<sup>th</sup> April, for two adults.
